



## Dog Tags Reunited with Veterans and Families

Auxiliary member, Sue Quinn-Morris, who heads up the Dog Tag Project reported that some dog tags have been returned with the help of the Nam Knights in several different states, including Oklahoma, Kentucky, Florida, Arizona and Kansas.

The collection of dog tags were given to Sue several years ago by retired Chief of Police (Deptford, NJ) Ray Milligan. Milligan was a volunteer with a group called Operation Smile, a medical mission that travels the globe and performs corrective surgery for chil-

dren with cleft palates or cleft lips, mostly in Third World countries. Milligan, a former Force Recon Marine who'd served in Vietnam, had gone to Vietnam as logistics support coordinator for the medical program and obtained the dog tags there. Sue's mission is to return the dog tags to the veterans they belong to or their families. 


