

American Legion Scholarship Awards



MESSAGE from the SAL COMMANDER



I hope that everyone had a very Happy Holiday, a Ho-Ho-Ho Merry Christmas, and an extremely

fulfilling New Year! The Seasonal festivities were second to none, with both the Christmas and New Year's Eve parties touted as raging successes. The "Pot Luck" gang came through again providing a plethora of mouthwatering delights.

Thanks in part to the donation that our squadron made to the Ladies Auxiliary, and their hard work, dedication and donations, the veterans at "Home For The Brave" were also treated to a Happy Holiday season. Our Sr. Vice Commander, Dave D'Orazio, participated in these activities, and has penned the following to enlighten us about this worthwhile endeavor:

"Along with members of our post I had the opportunity to visit Veterans at the "Home For The Brave" in Camden NJ. This organization provides housing and much more for homeless Veterans from all military branches that are going through rough patches after serving our country. Some are having trouble finding work after their service and some are suffering with different ailments including PTSD. The goal of "Home For The Brave" is to prepare our Vets to live on their own and to prepare them for employment. One of the resident Vets will be taking the test for his CDL Truck Driver's License!

There is no set residency time limit. The average stay is three months to one year. The facility has dormitory style rooms which will accommodate up to 30 Veterans. There are two beds in every room and a TV. Each Vet has a bureau and closet, Wi-Fi is available too. A community room is set up with a large screen HDTV and right next to this area is the kitchen. Various books and magazines are available too. Each Vet has daily duties to perform while residing at "Home For The Brave". The inside and outside of the building is very clean. There is definitely an air of positive energy at the Home For The Brave!

The Camden County Health Connection visits the Vets once a month. Registered nurses will run blood tests and health advisors will consult with the Vets about any health conditions they are facing. Career Advisors are available and teachers volunteer to help anyone that might be struggling with reading or writing.

Just before Christmas and right after the new year I had the opportunity to visit the "Home For The Brave" with members from our post. The Sons of American Legion and the Ladies Auxiliary made donations which provided Christmas gifts for each of the Veterans. Some of our members spent time with the veterans on Christmas Day. Just after the new year we visited the veterans and provide lunch and snacks for the vets. Our Ladies Auxiliary members have been visiting the facility since it opened over two years ago. It is evident with every visit how appreciative the Veterans are of the generosity of our post.

All Veterans who have participat-

ed in the programs at the "Home For The Brave" are on their way to leading independent and successful lives. As an example one Vet is currently working at a local diner and supporting himself. It is a credit to this organization that the veterans who have transitioned through the programs have not returned to the facility.

It was a moving experience to visit and talk with the veterans and feel the warmth of their gratitude and desire to get back on their feet to live independent lives. I would like to make a habit of visiting our veterans and I hope more and more Post 372 members will visit the "Home For The Brave" too. The men and women who have selflessly served our country deserve facilities like this one."

Thanks Dave for sharing this experience with us and hopefully motivating us to participate in these activities in the future. We will also be discussing the "2015/2016 Commander's Projects" over the next several meetings and will decide, as a squadron, where best to designate additional funding for Veteran's needs.
