POW/MIA Recognition Day—3rd Friday in September



Until July 18, 1979, no commemoration was held to honor America's POW/MIAs. That first year, resolutions were passed in the Congress and the national ceremony was held at the National Cathedral. Washington, D.C. The Missing Man formation was flown by the 1st Tactical Squadron, Langley AFB, Virginia. The Veterans Administration published a poster including only the letters "POW/MIA" and

that format was continued until 1982, when a black and white drawing of a POW in harsh captivity was used to convey the urgency of situation and the priority that President Ronald Reagan assigned to achieving the fullest possible accounting for Americans still missing from the Vietnam War.

National POW/MIA Recognition Day legislation was introduced yearly, until 1995 when it was deemed by Congress that legislation designating special commemorative days would no longer anced the focus to honor all be considered by Congress. The President now signs a proclamation each year. In the early years, the date was routinely set in close proximity to the League's annual meetings. In the mid-1980's, the American Ex-POWs decided that they wished to see

the date established as April 9th, the date during World War II when the largest number of Americans were captured. As a result, legislation urged by the American Ex-POWs was passed covering two years, July 20, 1984 and April 9, 1985, as the commemoration dates.

The 1984 National POW/MIA Recognition Day ceremony was held at the White House, hosted by President Ronald Reagan. At that most impressive ceremony, the Reagan Administration balreturned POWs and renew naas fully as possible for those still missing. Perhaps the most impressive Missing Man formation ever flown was that year, up the Ellipse and over the White House, Unfortunately, the 1985

ceremony was canceled due to inclement weather, a concern that had been expressed when the April 9th date was proposed.

Subsequently, in an effort to accommodate all returned POWs and all Americans still missing and unaccounted for from all wars, the National League of Families proposed the third Friday in September, a date not associated with any particular war and not in conjunction with any organization's national convention.

The second-largest contingent of **New Jersey National Guard soldiers** to be deployed overseas since World War II left for Texas in June, on the way to Qatar.

The soldiers are going to provide command and control for U.S. units already in place in the Persian Gulf state to support Operation Enduring Freedom. The most well-known campaign in that operation is in Afghanistan, but the counterterrorism mission has been active in Africa and the Philippines, among other locations.

In all. 16.000 soldiers have been mustered from the Garden State ranks since 2001 as part of operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom, Guard officials said. Many Team Leader of the 1/114th Alpha of the 450 soldiers who left for Qatar Comp of Mt on Wednesday were deployed to Iraq in 2008 when 2,900 New Jersevans — the largest combat deployment of the New Jersey National Guard since World War II — were sent to that gulf state.

The deployment comes at a time when the militant group the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria, or ISIS, has launched a lightning-fast offensive that seized several northern Iragi cities, including Mosul, where U.S. forces met tough resistance in trying to seize the city in 2004. American trained and equipped Iraqi security forces have crumbled in the face of the offensive, leaving behind their weapons, vehicles and uniforms.

The deployment of New Jerseyans

now is coincidental. The 1/114th has been training for the mission in Qatar for about a year. But they are going at a time when President Obama has bolstered the U.S. presence in the Middle East by reinforcing the U.S. Embassy in Baghdad with 275 soldiers and Marines, and sending the USS George H.W. Bush to the Persian Gulf along with a guided-missile cruiser and a guided-missile destroyer. The bulk of American combat forces left Iraq in 2011.

Among the 450 soldiers from four companies of the 1st Battalion of the 114th Infantry Regiment, is Spec Chris Carr Jr. He joined the Natl Guard Armory in 2010. He is
