



Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day—December 7th

1941 America's naval base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii was attacked by the Imperial Japanese Navy. At about 8 a.m., Japanese planes filled the sky over Pearl Harbor. Bombs and bullets rained onto the vessels moored below. At 8:10, a 1,800-pound bomb smashed through the deck of the battleship USS Arizona and landed in her forward ammunition magazine. The ship exploded and sank with more than 1,000 men trapped inside. Next, torpedoes pierced the shell of the battleship USS Oklahoma. With 400 sailors aboard, the Oklahoma lost her balance, rolled onto her side and slipped underwater. By the time the attack was over, every battleship in Pearl Harbor had sustained significant damage.

On Sunday morning, December 7, In all, the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor crippled or destroyed 18 American ships and nearly 300 airplanes. Dry docks and airfields were likewise destroyed. More importantly, 2,403 American military personnel and civilians were killed and another 1,178 were injured. The day after the Day Services in our local area. attack, the United States declared

war on Japan and entered World War II. President Franklin Roosevelt, in a speech to Congress, stated that the bombing of Pearl Harbor is "a date which will live in infamy".

As the date approaches, check the local newspaper for Remembrance




