## Our Post History & Closing of 2018

As another year passes, Post 372 is proud to reflect on all the time and efforts our members have made to help our veterans, community and active military.

Enclosed you will find a recap of some of the most memorable and meaningful endeavors we have participated in during the last quarter of 2018.

The upcoming year, 2019, marks the Centennial mark for the American Legion organization.

Legion Posts nationwide, including our Post, will be celebrating

the American Legions 100th anniversary. Be sure to stay tuned for special plans in the near future.

Our American Legion Post 372, chartered in 1950, has been proudly serving our veterans and community for over 68 years!

Over the course of the year, we will be sharing a wealth of the American Legion Post 372's history, including old Scoop newsletters, photos, news articles and more!

To start the year off, we will begin at our beginning.....



## Our American Legion Post 372 Beginning

In 1949, a group of veterans, mostly of World War II vintage, became interested in forming an American Legion Post in what was then known as Delaware Township.

Before the war, Delaware Township, now Cherry Hill, was a sprawling area of farmland and wide-open spaces, with few residences and businesses. Veterans in the area became members of American Legion posts in nearby towns. Members of Haddonfield

Post 38, one of the oldest posts in the State, assisted with the organization, some becoming charter members of the new post.

The prospective members envisioned an organization that would be the vehicle for a lifetime of devoted service to God, Country, their former comrades, their widows and orphans, and all veterans.

They had observed other posts, and noted how their members had progressed from combat duty to

community service, and wanted to be part of bringing this type of service organization to their fast-growing community.

Delaware Township Memorial Post 372 received its temporary charter on May 18, 1950, a permanent charter on August 31, 1951, and was officially renamed Cherry Hill Memorial Post 372 on March 19, 1964.

Before the dedication of the present Post Home on November 10, 1957, the officers and members

met in a building located on Hollis Avenue and Haddonfield Road, a site which was occupied by Capuano's Restaurant for many years afterwards.

### **THE FORMATIVE YEARS**

The idea for forming an American Legion Post in Delaware Township was conceived in the spring of 1949. Temporary officers were appointed, and Edward Lacey became Acting Commander.

The next few months were spent on organization. During these months, even before permanent officers were elected, the Post planned its first activity, a picnic. The affair, which was intended merely to pay for itself, showed a profit, and gave the Post its first experience in making money. A common bond started to develop between members, and lasting friendships were being formed. Permanent officers were elected at the second meeting, in September 1950. Two of the post's officers were recalled to active duty during the Korean Conflict, and a member was killed in an automobile accident; the post's first recorded loss of a member. Building of the monthly social, formation of a Post Auxiliary, welfare activity, community betterment projects (Little League), the acquisition of a property, and leasing of a building for use as Post Home were all accomplished in this first year.

The County and State organizations formally presented the permanent charter to the post in a ceremony held in October 1950.

The first important achievement of that year was the completion of the Post's Constitution and by-laws. On Memorial Day 1951, Post 372 joined with members of the Delaware Township's VFW Post to provide suitable ceremonies over graves of veterans in various Township cemeteries.

On the 4th of July 1952 the Post again joined with the VFW in a parade through the streets of Ertont. The Post also participated in a Camden Country parade on Armistice Day 1952, along Broadway in Camden.

Early in 1954, discussions began regarding the sending of a delegate to Boys' State, and in June of that year, one boy was sent. In December 1954, the first issue of "The Scoop" was prepared, printed, and mailed to the members. Steps were soon taken to start work on the new Post Home. Floor plans were drawn up and discussed.

As the Americanism program developed, the Post sponsored a Boy Scout Troop, conducted a "Safety Essay" in Township schools, participated in the Township's "Youth Week: had at the Garden State Park, and continued to add other youth-related activities.

One of the rapidly growing Post's members was elected Camden County Commander, and another member to the Vice Commander's position. Ground was broken for construction of the new Post Home on February 2, 1957, and

construction was completed, with occupation and dedication of the Home on Sunday, November 10, 1964.

### Legion to Induct Post Tonight in Delaware Twp.

Delaware Township Post 372 will be inducted formally into the ranks of the American Legion at ceremonies tonight.

County Commander Albert E. Davis and his staff will install officers.

The ceremonies will be held in Woodland firehouse, Route 38 and Chapel avenue, Delaware township.

Fifty odd members of the post will be initiated by the degree team of the Forty and Eight, headed by Chef de Gare Leo Norton.

The officers elected recently by members of the Delaware township post are Edward P. Lacy, commander; John E. Cunningham, senior vice commander; John E. Yeomans, junior vice commander; Robert H. Ramsey, adjutant; Lawrence G. Wittwer, finance officer; Edward B. Beckett, service officer; Earl V. Seely, chaplain; James J. Gerrow, historian, and Charles J. Reed, welfare officer.

Elected to the post executive committee were August H. Kramer and Albert F. Guenther. Delegate to the county committee of the Legion is John Allison, with August H. Kramer, alternate.

Plans are being made for a dinner to be held soon for members and their wives. An entertainment program is being planned for the remainder of the Legion year.

rel— American Legion Riders, Warriors Watch and other motorcyclists circled the restaurant and went inside to show their appreciation and gratitude for his service.


He was then escorted back to his mothers home in Marlton, where the Fire Department, Operation Yellow Ribbon and others awaited his arrival.

After the race, Tom Pagano and friends picked up the flags from the


route and dropped them off at the American Legion.
